### VI. <u>Action and Discussion Items</u> (Violent Crime Community Discussion)

### Key Points Highlighted:

- 1. Youth Crimes Prevention should start early (middle school); Mentors are needed; Juvenile Justice connects to resources; Communities Supporting Schools programs (Restorative Justice formerly Teen Court Success Coaches in schools Arts Execute engages youth in the arts); HACG has youth and teen programs GPD has Explorer program for youth; Men Who Care of Goldsboro mentors at North Drive Elementary and Dillard Middle School.
- 2. Root-Cause-Corrective-Action shared as tool to approach issues.
- 3. Mental Health Trillium/Eastpointe continues to provide services to Wayne County.
- 4. Crime has a domino effect. All are affected.
- 5. HACG offers the Jobs Plus program to residents.
- 6. HACG recommended GPD move into vacant unit at Lincoln Homes
- 7. GPD discussed available documents that address crime: Trespass Agreement, Residential Keep Check. Discussed the need for community help via Crime Stoppers, Neighborhood

Crime Watch, Our Community Cares (former initiative). Discussed tsunami cameras in high crime areas.

- 8. Guns on the streets are mostly stolen from other communities and states.
- 9. Poverty is an underlying issue to crime.
- 10. Collaborations are needed.
